Eligibility Requirements:

- Students whose backgrounds and/or identities are underrepresented at the University of Minnesota.
- Students who will be full-time undergraduate juniors or seniors at any of the University of Minnesota's campuses during the Fall 2024 semester, with a minimum of four semesters completed coursework at the University.
- Students with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA.
- Students who demonstrate outstanding achievement and in the following areas:
 - Demonstrated commitment to advancing diversity, equity, and inclusion within the chosen field of study.
 - Demonstrated commitment to advancing diversity, equity, and inclusion through community outreach and engagement.
 - Demonstrated commitment to advancing diversity, equity, and inclusion through exemplary leadership activities.

SUE W. HANCOCK SEEDs OF CHANGE AWARDS

The Andrews SEED Award was created by Milton and Danae Andrews through the University of Minnesota Foundation to support students demonstrating impressive engagement with and commitment to issues of equity and diversity through outstanding academic achievement and activism. In writing your letter of recommendation, ask your recommender to consider the following three questions:

- How long and in what capacity have you known the applicant?
- How has the applicant demonstrated to you their commitment to academic achievement and community engagement? Tell us about specific DEI-centered projects the applicant has been involved in or has led.
- How does the applicant advance equity, diversity, and inclusion, in the classroom and/or through their community activism?

- Provide specific examples about how your academic and extracurricular activities advance diversity, equity, and inclusion at the University and in the broader community.
 - o What types of issues DEI issues are you addressing?
 - Discuss any leadership roles or projects you have taken on in your DEI-related activities and tell us about the impact of this work. Be as specific as possible in telling us about DEI-related projects at the U of M or in the community that you have been involved in or led and the impact it has had on others.
 - What are your plans for future DEI work?
